"We had a great turnout then, too", said Johnson.

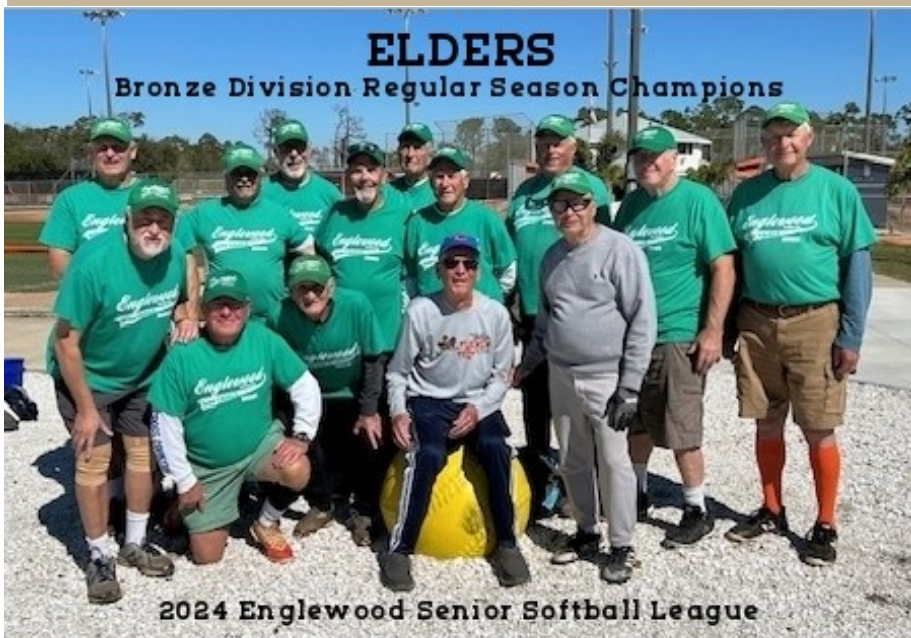
