The Englewood Men's senior softball league officially passed the halfway point of the winter season last week, with a full slate of games completed and the homerun barrage in full swing. Let's get right to the scores.

On Tuesday in the Bronze division, the Legends topped the Classics 21 to 14 while the Relics crushed the Elders 28 to 9. In Thursday's Bronze games, the Classics edged the Elders 16 to 15 and the Relics beat the Legends 16 to 14.

Also on Tuesday in the Silver division, the Riverwood Relics edged the Englewood Elks 28 to 27 to earn their first win of the season. In other games, the Purple Panthers beat Designer Tee's 21 to 12; Xpertech Auto Repair beat Libee's Sports Bar 17 to 13 while in the showdown game between Caddy Cart's and Artur's Restaurant, Caddy Carts was victorious winning 20 to 12.

In Thursday's Silver games, several teams put up some big numbers as the Purple Panthers topped Artur's Restaurant 32 to 26 and Caddy Carts rolled over the Englewood Elks 28 to 3; Libee's Sports Bar beat the Riverwood Relics 14 to 11 while Designer Tee's just edged Xpertech Auto Repair 16 to 15.

On Wednesday over in the Gold division, there were 5 homeruns hit in the four games played, the long ball barrage continuing. Lance Magnussen got his first dinger of the season but it wasn't quite enough as the Shipwreck Pub fell to New Faull Inn, 19 to 17. Ted Phillips of the End Zone Sports bar also got his first homerun of the season in a losing effort as the Zone fell to Key Agency 18 to 12. The Englewood Moose Lodge 1933 beat Scott's / Ken & Barb's Restaurant 24 to 15 behind two homeruns from Brian Donehue and a long fence clearing bomb from Mike Vaught. In the fourth game of the day, Premier Tee's - Gulf Coast Moose beat the Hitmen 17 to 9.

In Friday's games, New Faull Inn topped Scott's Ken & Barbs Restaurant 23 to 13; the Hitmen edged Key Agency 11 to 10 in a close battle; the Shipwreck Pub beat the End Zone 16 to 15 in extra innings while the Englewood Moose beat Premier Tee's / Gulf Coast Moose 27 to 19 behind another home run from Brian Donehue, his 11th of the year.

Having entered the second half of the season, the league continues to see some great play in all three divisions and the home run barrage this year is off the charts compared to prior years with 14 players clearing the fences a total of thirty times. Fans have marveled at the play with some great defensive plays being made on that side of the game as well. So, with the weather warming up, grab a cup of iced coffee and come on out and join the fun.
